

The 2012-2013 LCBI High School year is drawing to a close, and when we look back on the year we feel joy! There have been challenges and change to embrace and at times endure, but this is LIFE and through this God has walked ahead, planning and paving the way for LIFE.

The Leadership Team has been blessed by an ever-amazing staff; the amount of extra-curricular programming a small staff such as ours pulls off for the students is quite phenomenal. The students have blessed us with their academic prowess, artistic flare, athletic feats, and servant hearted spirit. LCBI High School students do very well academically; we are blessed with students coming to us who are typically stronger academically and that preparedness in conjunction with solid teaching, structured study time and small class sizes and extra teacher attention means our students rate very well provincially. The number of Grade 10-12 credits per graduate for LCBI is 31.50 compared to the Province at 27.19. Average final marks for 8 Level 30 classes for 2011/2012 were 76.19 for LCBI High School compared to 73.23 for the Province.

The Leadership Team has embarked on some important initiatives which are crucial for the continued success of LCBI High School. Those include: hiring a marketing firm out of Saskatoon who has reviewed the school's positioning with us and is now working on brand redevelopment, developing marketing/media strategies and student recruitment strategies, and redesign and production of LCBI's website; increasing and more efficient communication with the wider constituency; and increasing the province's and country's awareness of LCBI High School and what we can offer students. We are forming ever closer bonds with the Saskatchewan Historical High School Association comprising Notre Dame, Luther College, Rosthern Junior College, Rivier Academy and Caronport High School. As a collective we are impressive. We have volunteered to be part of the Ministry of Education Continuous Improvement Accountability Framework; and we will report to the Ministry a School Learning Plan as well as goals. We are confident we will see the fruits of these initiatives in the following year and for years to come.

Our dreams for LCBI's future include exploring International Baccalaureate academic programs, developing an exemplary Agriculture program with authentic community partnerships, a purposeful and meaningful Campus Life curriculum for LIFE, regular alumni involvement in the day to day workings of the school, a School Community Council comprised of a small group of willing parents to work alongside staff to make LCBI High School the best experience if can be for students, and an increased awareness by our country of who LCBI High School is and what we have to offer youth.

We have had a great year; we are moving forward in God's grace and we are absolutely 100% committed to LCBI High School. LCBI High School looks forward to the 2013-2014 school year and all the new faces who will join this family, centered on seeing Christ.

After 35 years of teaching and coaching at our beloved school, LCBI, I have decided to move on to the next phase of my life. What a ride it has been. When I stepped foot on campus in the Fall of 1978, one of the first things we did as a staff was gather together in prayer. It felt like God was gathering me up in His arms and it felt really good. This was in sharp contrast to the summer construction jobs that I worked at where God's name was also invoked, but not often revered.

I have been blessed with an understanding and supportive wife (Bea) and four daughters, Olivia, Carolyn, Janet and Leah who have encouraged, supported, counseled, scolded and enabled me to carry out my daily activities at our school. Without them, my time here would have been a much shorter term.

The one thing that I will regret upon leaving LCBI is the missed opportunity to meet and work with the amazing young people that will pass through our doors after I leave. I know that I am biased in my perception, but few schools can boast the quality of young people that graduate from our school. Our world is in good shape for the future with these fine young men and women taking on the challenge of contributing to our society and the Kingdom of God.

I would like to thank all of the Alumni who support our school in so many different ways. You provide the wind beneath the wings of the staff who work day by day at our school through your prayers and financial support. You are the best Alumni in the world!
